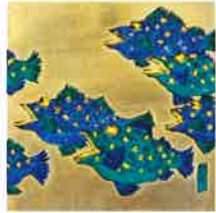

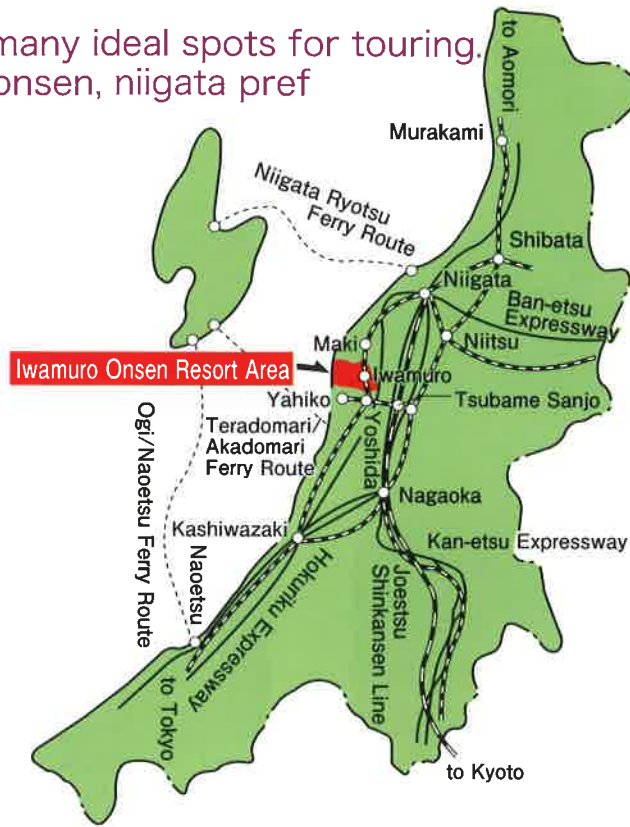


Hot Springs

Iwamuro Onsen has been favored as a hot springs area on the Hokkoku Highway (Hokkoku Kaido) for 300 years. The efficacy of the hot springs, the fact that they are surrounded by nature (natural elements of the sea, the mountains, and fields), the prefecture's position near the central part of the Sea of Japan, and the convenience of the surrounding tourist areas all combine to make it one of the best areas in the nation.

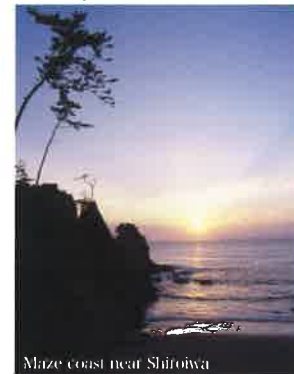
The traditional entertaining arts of the geisha in Niigata Prefecture have their beginnings in Iwamuro Onsen. There are many geisha, from young girls in their twenties to highly experienced ladies belonging to this geisha association which has been in existence since the Edo Period. Spending the evening with a geisha is one way to experience the true atmosphere of traditional Japanese dining entertainment. In recent years they've been

popular for women's events as well and have received high praise. Iwamuro Onsen—being surrounded by the natural beauty of the ocean, the mountains, and fields—is a place with abundant amounts of food which can be used as ingredients for various things. We'll welcome you with food shaped by conditions of both climate and history.

- Spring: masu salmon, yanagi flounder, rosy seabass, sea bream, Japanese Blue Crab, wild vegetables.
- Summer: asaba flounder, sillago (sand smelts), horse mackerel, oyster, kuruma shrimp (Japanese tiger prawn), Alaskan pink shrimp, jinkumame, eggplant
- Autumn: tilefish, Japanese fluvial sculpin, salmon, mackerel, edible chrysanthemum, koshinikari brand rice, taina (pickled vegetable)
- Winter: octopus, Japanese amberjack, goosefish (anglerfish), pacific cod, winter vegetables

Both deciduous trees such as beech, and evergreen trees such as camellia bushes are found within the Taho Mountain Range, located within the Sato Yahiko Yoneyama Nationally Designated Park and is host to as many different kinds of plant-life as there are landscapes. As the majority of the mountains in the Taho chain are within the Specially Designated National Park, we ask for your cooperation in helping to protect their environment.

Fishing

Plenty of fishing spots are located along the seaside line, where the northernmost limit of the Tsushida current (a warm current) flows. Areas around Tachi-iwa, Maze Harbor, Senzoku, Shishi-ga-Hama, Kakuta Nisaki, and Teradomari Harbor are all examples of such areas.

Remnants of Tenjin-zan Castle

Historical Landmark History Art Museum

There are many museums and shrines connected to Echigo history found along the Hokkoku Highway near Iwamuro, including Yasuhiko Shrine and places having to do with the historical figure, Ryokan Taigu.

The entire area of Tenjin-zan, at an altitude of 234 meters, has been demarcated as the site of the remnants of a castle that was built in 1153 (3rd year of Ninbei) and administrated by Saneyori Oguni (later Saneyori Oguni) in 1582 (10th year of Tensho). Saneyori Oguni was featured as a character in the 2009 NHK television drama "Tenchijin" (written by Masashi Hisaka) as the younger brother of the main character Kamikanetsugu Naoeyamashiro. Both brothers spent their lives serving the nobles of the Uesugi household.

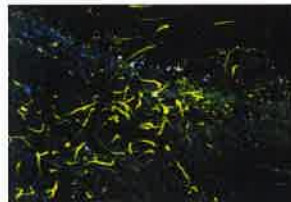
